The Black Ship sails boldly through parallel universes governed by different, often disconcerting laws. So, if you like your poetry tame and predictable, stay clear! But if prospects of mind-bending, shape-shifting oddity laced with mordant humour intrigue you, then jump aboard this outlandish, artfully engineered vessel. Your sense of our own world's primal strangeness is sure to be enlarged.

David Clink combines in his newest work everything that makes his previous books distinctive; an off-kilter sense of humour that observes the mundane and gives it new life and importance; and the ability to make fictional worlds address the emotional truths of our daily lives.
